

King Edward St Parking Info

Park 'n' Ride options

Perhaps the simplest option is to use one of the city's various Park 'n' Ride car parks, which have connecting buses into the city centre. These are located on the edge of the city at every major route into Oxford. We are less than a 2 minute walk from the city-centre bus stops. Here's a link for details of the Park 'n' Ride:

On-street, short-stay (2hrs), pay and display parking

There is a very limited number (about 12) of 'Pay and Display' on-street parking spaces on King Edward Street itself. There is quite a quick turnover of cars, so if full sometimes loitering for a bit will yield a space when someone leaves – but it is quite hit and miss.

These spaces are short-stay and therefore limited to 2 hours – for which the charge is £5. You can stay for 30 mins for £1.50. There are some other similar spaces 200 years down the road, around the corner on Merton St. You can move there after two hours and pay for another 2 hours, which gives you 4 hours on street parking in the vicinity for £10 in total.

Be careful to avoid the No Go 'Bus Gate'

If driving directly to the practice, take care to avoid the 'bus gate' on the High Street – this is a 30 metre section of the High Street that has camera enforcement and all vehicles that are not a bus get charged a £60 fine for driving through it (a bit like the London Congestion Charge). This section is clearly signed at the point of potential entry and there are warning signs from as far as a mile away (which often confuses people).

You can drive directly to our front door without going through this section if you come from the south or the west (i.e. Abingdon Road/ St Aldates), despite the warning signs.

If coming from the east (i.e. Magdalen Bridge/ Cowley Rd/ St Clements) then following a sat-nav is likely to take you through the bus gate and you'll get a fine. To avoid this, turn first left at the first set of traffic lights after The Plain roundabout, by the Eastgate Hotel/ Marco Pierre White's onto Merton St, and follow this cobbled road all the way to the end. If the rising bollard is blocking your way into King Edward St, park up temporarily and come and speak to the practice – we have a card to lower the bollard.



Follow red route from Magdalen Bridge, along the High St and then turn left at the lights down Merton St to avoid the 'bus gate.'

Follow green route from the South, via Abingdon Rd and St Aldates, to drive to the High St and the front door on King Edward St.

Follow the yellow route from Botley Rd and the train station (or the Oxpens Car Park) to drive to the High St & the front door on King Edward St.
